Heart to Heart...

After a few minutes, the young man stood up, crossed the room to the office door, walking right in. The other applicants looked up wondering what was going on. Within a few minutes, the employer walked out with the young man and spoke these words to the other applicants: *"Thank you for coming in, but the job has been filled."* The applicants began to grumble and complain. One spoke out, *"I don't understand! He just came in and walked into your office and we never got an opportunity to speak with you. It's not fair!"* The employer spoke, *"For the last several minutes while you were sitting here, talking with one another caught up in your own world, the telegraph has been ticking out the following message in Morse Code: 'If you understand this message, then come right in! The job is yours!'"*

Many times people are really good at talking and not good at listening. It amazes me at the lack of listening skills so many have. Jesus warned His disciples, *"So take care how you listen; for whoever has, to him more shall be given; and whoever does not have, even what he thinks he has shall be taken away."* (Luke 8:18) Listening carefully to the Lord is what will take one deeper and deeper into the spiritual insight from the Lord. Listening to the wrong things can be spiritually destructive.

Are you a good listener? How much do we miss from the Lord because we are listening to the wrong sources? Maybe that's why so many are weak and sick spiritually! Some might even be dead because they have listened too long to the wrong things! Think about it!!!
